2nd Alarmers Finds New Home at Coal Valley Fire Dept.

The Moline Second Alarmers Association Air 12, is crucial support vehicle operated by dedicated volunteers. Air 12 is a mobile air replenishment unit that provides on-scene breathing air refill and rehab services, ensuring firefighters can stay safe and effective during prolonged emergencies.

Air 12 assists the are fire departments through Mutual Aid Box Alarm System (MABAS) by providing on-scene breathing air refill and rehabilitation service. MABAS Units 39 & 43 includes Rock Island County, Henry County, Mercer County as well as the Rock Island Arsenal Fire Department & the Quad City International Airport

Their air System consists of a 6-tank air cascade system, each tank holds up to 6K PSI for Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA) refills.

Second Alarmers is made up entirely of volunteers and responds to working general alarm fires and bringing essential support to our fire fighting teams. The dedication and expertise of the Second Alarmers make a difference when it matters most.

The Second Alarmers were started in 1952, proudly served the Moline Fire Department for 73 years. On March 21, 2025, the Second Alarmers were notified by the City of Moline that they can no longer use city-owned facilities and vehicles, citing a review of liability and insurance protocols.

In response to this potential loss of essential volunteers, Coal Valley Fire Protection District Chief Dave Dunham proposed the Coal Valley Fire Department as a new operational base for the Second Alarmers group. In doing so, they remain an independent organization and will continue their mission of supporting local fire departments throughout our area. Chief Dunham states "After a discussion with the command staff and fire board, we decided to bring them (Second Alarmers) to Coal Valley. I believe this will be a great asset to Coal Valley and its family."

As of April 1st, the Moline Second Alarmers will have to vacate the city-owned, and previous Moline fire station building, that the group works out of, located at 2702 4th Avenue, Moline. Ken LeMaster, President of the Moline Second Alarmers told KWQC TV 6 News that they also won't be able to take their fire truck that the Moline Second Alarmers had donated to the City of Moline or any of the property on the truck or inside the building that the group had acquired. The fire truck was donated to the City of Moline because the volunteer group could not afford the insurance on it.

An emergency meeting was held on March 25th at the Coal Valley Fire Protection District building with the Moline Second Alarmers to discuss pursuing an agreement. "I think



it's a positive for the Coal Valley Fire Protection District to bring them on," said Chief David Dunham to KWQC "I think there's people there that have talents that could be utilized to help out our fire department district. Coal Valley's a combination fire department. We have 12 full time staff, 16 part-time members, and four volunteers. We're hurting for volunteers just as much as any other agency is. I looked at it totally different than the City of Moline. So, I looked at it as getting volunteers into the organization."

Bins will be available for drop off at the Coal Valley Maintenance Garage,











